The Alps are much earlier and more strongly affected by climate change than other regions in Europe. Coping with the various effects of climate change is a key challenge for the Alpine Space. Joint efforts and cooperation are indispensable to adapt and to mitigate impacts. This workshop wants to support an active exchange between all on-going projects in the Alps.



### Three thematic workshops for the Alpine Space

This is the first of a series of three thematic workshops which the Alpine Space Programme is organising as it approaches half-time of this current programme period 2007-2013.

First project results are underway and with a crosscutting perspective, each of these workshops will take a look beyond the three programme priorities Competitiveness & Attractiveness - Accessibility & Connectivity - Environment & Risk Prevention at strategic key issues affecting the cooperation area and addressed by several of the running projects.
