Small-scale projects



- Make greater use of synergies and complementarities
- Reach out to newcomers who are eager to take part in transnational cooperation
- Address innovative subjects through:
 - Set the scene projects that are rather new to transnational cooperation
 - Capitalisation actions to "roll-out" available tools and solutions and promote the up-take for greater impact

Selling points for quality projects



- Demonstrate transnational approach
- Build a solid partnership
- Ensure that outputs are durable and transferable
- Be familiar with the policy context
- Follow a clear intervention logic

- Simplification of rules and procedures
- Simplified cost options
- Harmonisdation with other programmes



Simplication procedures

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Joint e-Monitoring System for Interreg programmes



- Official launch at end January or early February 2022
 - AF template (Word document) to work offline available in the next days
 - about 1 month to copy-paste everything online
- Tips:
 - Read carefully the technical guidance (available soon)
 - Do not wait the very last minute to apply online
 - Save on a regular basis

Call opens for classic project proposals (19 November 2021)

Deadline for submisssion in step 1 (28 February 2022)

Online support to applicants in January 2022

JEMS online at end of January or early February 2022

- Assessment by the JS against pre-selected strategic and operational criteria, including national verifications by ACPs
- Project assessment done based on the information submitted at the time of application
- Selection by the programme committee
- Get started seminars for selected projects


