

### (1) IMPROVE COORDINATION BETWEEN ORGANISATIONS AT ALL LEVELS OF GOVERNMENT AND GOVERNANCE

- Bring people together with new formats
- Invest time in building personal relationships
- Clarify roles, responsibilities and expectations









# (2) DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT PLACE-SPECIFIC ACTION RESPONDING TO TERRITORIAL NEEDS TO FOSTER INTEGRATED PLACE-BASED APPROACHES;

- Focus on boarders perceived by people
- Assessment of territorial needs
- Cross-border functional areas
