Priority 1: Climate resilient and green Alpine region (PO 2)

SO iv: promoting climate change adaptation, risk prevention and disaster resilience

SO vii: enhancing biodiversity, green infrastructure in the urban environment, and reducing pollution

Priority 2: Carbon neutral & resource sensitive Alpine region (PO 2)

SO i: promoting energy efficiency

SO vi: promoting the transition to a circular economy

Priority 3: Innovation and digitalisation oriented green Alpine region (PO 1)

SO i: enhancing research and innovation capacities and the uptake of advanced technologies

SO ii: reaping the benefits of digitisation for citizens, companies and governments

We need to raise awareness on the definition and potentials of social innovation in all the Alpine countries and help the people to know how they can transform their ideas into real practices.


Social innovation can focus on culture, sport, health, food... With the people's ideas we will be able to revitalise territories and start virtuous cycles.










Messages from the breakout rooms - Potentials of digitalisation

Messages from the breakout rooms - Services of general interest

Our priority should be to bridge the gap when it comes to services between rural and urban areas.

We need to rethink how we do our projects. We should aim for smaller scale and more pilot projects.

We need to involve smaller scale partners such as smaller rural municipalities in our projects to be truly efficient.

The challenges we need to address in priority is the access of young and elderly people in rural areas to general services.
