



| Total budget | €1m to €3m |
| Co-financing rate | 75% |
| Duration | 24 to 36 months |
| Partnership | 7 to 12 partners |
| Transnationality | at least 4 countries |
| Selection | 2-step procedure |
| Submission | JEMS |

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVE

Promoting climate change adaption and disaster risk prevention, and resilience, taking into account eco-system based approaches

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVE

Enhancing protection and preservation of nature, biodiversity and green infrastructure, including urban areas, and reducing all forms of pollution

2 CARBON NEUTRAL AND RESOURCE SENSITIVE ALPINE REGION

Promoting energy efficiency and reducing greenhouse gas emissions

Promoting the transition to a circular and resource efficient economy

3 INNOVATION AND DIGITALISATION SUPPORTING A GREEN ALPINE REGION

Developing and enhancing research and innovation capacities and the uptake of advanced technologies

Reaping the benefits of digitalisation for citizens, companies, research organisations and public authorities

Examples of project ideas



Project idea : developing innovative approaches to involve effectively stakeholders from various sectors (e.g. renewable energy production / tourism / agriculture / biodiversity conservation) in order to enable species migration between Alpine-specific biodiversity hotspots.

- Develop a protocol to involve the targeted stakeholders with different means
- Test this innovative approach in several existing biodiversity corridors
- Promote its integration in transnational and regional policies

Project idea : Experiment a digital model of land use scenarios in peri-urban areas to support local authorities in climate-resilient spatial planning.

- Prepare a common methodology to develop the tool
- Get different local authorities to experiment this solution
- Make the improved tool available in open-source and create a community of users




Intervention logic and outputs


Recommendations:
