

### The project

#### Intertwining cultures

AlpTextyles is **an Interreg Alpine Space project** that begins with intangible cultural heritage as a foundation for future thinking.

Launched in 2022, it **gathers the rich, living traditions of Alpine textile ecosystems** to build a common ground of knowledge and expertise in research, innovation, and education.

The **12 partners** from Austria, France, Germany, Italy, Slovenia, and Switzerland join hands to develop collaborative solutions to tackle climate change and optimize the use of local resources.

#### Intangible cultural heritage

## Our collaborative approach

#### Leveraging Alpine craft and industrial know-how for sustainability

At the heart of AlpTextyles is a clear belief: the past holds the tools to build a more sustainable future.

Drawing from centuries-old textile knowledge rooted in the Alpine region, the project activates and reinterprets local resources—from **native sheep breeds** and **artisanal wool processing** to traditional **dyeing plants** and craft techniques.

Alpine local practices are being revived not as museum pieces, but as the foundation for new circular value chains.

AlpTextyles connects Alpine craft with contemporary innovation, promoting textile models that are ecologically responsible, socially rooted, and economically viable.

#### **Key goals:**

- Strengthen cross-border partnerships between regions and among producers, institutions, and designers
- Promote the sustainable use of local, natural resources, including endemic wool and natural dyes
- Foster collaboration collaboration between agricultural, industrial, and cultural policies
- Enhance the image and visibility of Alpine textile products, positioning them as sustainable and high-quality alternatives
- Encourage lifestyles rooted in sustainability and respect for nature





### 1. Map the status of the industry

AlpTextyles has undertaken a **comprehensive mapping of textile practices** across the Alpine region, both historical and contemporary. This research integrates local knowledge to assess cultural significance, sustainability, and resource utilization, providing a clear overview of heritage, value chains, consumer perceptions, and aesthetics.

### Focus: Research Day

Research Day was AlpTextyles' first event dedicated to presenting the initial research findings and engaging with target groups through a series of keynote speeches by **experts in the textile industry at the Alpine and international levels, EU representatives, and project partners**, networking breaks, and a dedicated exhibition.

#### **Guest speakers**

The turnout was extremely high, with <u>guest speakers</u> and participants praising the high level of the contents of the day and of the project in general.

#### **New opportunities**

Research Day opened new avenues of collaboration on projects and initiatives with several organizations, further expanding AlpTextyles' network and boosting its presence and relevance in the textile conversation at the European level.

- Collectif tricolor has asked AlpTextyles to contribute to creating their Feuille de route nationale pour la structuration des filières laines françaises.
- Agenzia Lane d'Italia has involved AlpTextyles in a series of projects on Italian policy making on the circularity of textile value chains.
- Slow Food has invited AlpTextyles to participate at a panel on wool as a waste product for Terra Madre Salone del Gusto, Turin, in September 2024.





## 2. Test future-ready solutions

How can heritage shape tomorrow's textile models?

AlpTextyles answered this question through **pilot actions in selected areas** — translating ideas into tangible practices. From Slovenia to Switzerland, each initiative wove together traditional knowledge, sustainability, and contemporary creativity.

Across borders, AlpTextyles engaged local communities, designers, educators, and producers in a shared effort to reimagine the future of textiles. The result: a collection of collaborative experiences that turn research into living culture.

# Highlights from our pilots 1/5

#### Learning & Practice Exchange | Škofja Loka, Slovenia\*

Artisan weavers from Valle Camonica visited Škofja Loka to experience its centuries-old textile traditions — hands-on felting, plant-based dyeing, and storytelling rooted in local knowledge.


#### Brächete Festival | Val Müstair, Austria

At this autumn flax harvest celebration, the Tessanda mill hosted a dialogue between old and new: artisanal techniques met fresh approaches to storytelling and marketing.

A tactile collection of objects tracing the industrial wool legacy of the Alps, created in collaboration with Fibershed. Natural dye experiments included indigo (Isatis tinctoria) and a vibrant yellow from native bark.




# Highlights from our pilots 2/5





At Milano Unica 2025, AlpTextyles presents a stand that is more than a showcase — it's a landscape to step into. Designed as a multi-sensory journey, the stand invites visitors to explore how Alpine textile traditions are being reimagined for a circular, regenerative future.

To AlpTextyles, heritage is not a memory—it's a resource. Every material, color, and texture on display reflects years of collaborative research, pilot actions, and community-based innovation across six Alpine countries.





# Highlights from the Stand at Milano Unica 1/3

#### Materials Area - "The Material Roots"

This is where raw materials take center stage: native alpine sheep wools, collected, classified, and narrated through the Library of Alpine Wools. Alongside, artisanal fabrics and natural dye tests showcase a return to ancestral knowledge and the exploration of nature-based fibers. A tactile display invites visitors to rediscover textures, scents, and the natural color variations shaped by the Alpine landscape.

Alpine wool is not just a material—it embodies culture, landscape, biodiversity, and sustainability.

#### Fashion Area - "Stories woven to wear"

Contemporary garments, developed through collaborations between designers and local textile chains, reveal the ethical and aesthetic potential of alpine wool. Each piece is accompanied by a short story of its creation—from pasture to wardrobe.

The future of fashion lies in rediscovering roots and regenerating local economies.





# Highlights from the Stand at Milano Unica 2/3

#### AlpTextyles Exhibition – "The Project as a Story"

An exhibition printed on textile panels guides visitors through the main work packages of the AlpTextyles project:

- research into local value chains
- consumer insights
- community engagement
- technical innovation and sustainability
- collaborative and experimental design
- cultural dissemination.

The fabric panels become narrative surfaces—evocative and light—consistent with the project's visual language.

#### Meeting Zone - "Weaving Connections"


